To state the obvious, make sure that your submissions are well written, well presented and properly evidenced. Take advice from a colleague whose judgment you respect. Your head of chambers and the Bar Mess Chairs should all be able to help. I am due to sit on the appeal panels and cannot therefore advise you myself about the particular content of your appeal submissions/evidence.
