QC or more than one advocate



Comes in to force 1st April 2013

Three potential criteria:

A - Exceptional

Case is exceptional compared with the generality of cases involving similar offences

B - Counsel

Prosecution have instructed QC or Senior Treasury Counsel

C-Prosecution

Prosecution have either:

- a) instructed two or more advocates, or
- b) more than 80 witnesses, or
- c) over 1000 pages of evidence
